Roumpini Dimopoulou is currently Assistant Professor of Medieval and Renaissance Latin Literature in the Department of Italian Language and Literature (National and Kapodistrian University of Athens). She graduated from the Faculty of Philology, Department of Classics (National and Kapodistrian University of Athens) in 1993, where in 2006 she completed her PhD thesis: *Hugo Favolius Hodoeporici Byzantini Liber III.*, Lovanii 1563, Linguistic – Interpretative Examination.

She has been teaching at the Department of Italian Language and Literature since 2009 (undergraduate and postgraduate level): Introduction in Latin Literature, Medieval Latin Literature, Medieval Latin Poetry, Renaissance Latin Literature, Italian Humanism: Latin works by Petrarch and Boccaccio, Philology and Typography: From manuscript to printed book, Travel Literature: Greece in travel accounts of Italian scholars, Greek influences on Italian Literature of the Renaissance.
